## HealthCare.gov Enrollment Hits 6 Million

Six million people had re-enrolled or selected a plan for the first time on HealthCare.gov as of Dec. 17, the last day to have coverage effective Jan. 1. The CMS says the figure is about 60% higher than the number who had done so at this point last year. Of the 6 million, 2.4 million are new to the marketplace, the agency said. Passive enrollment—when consumers are automatically re-enrolled in their current plans if they didn't choose another—will take place this month. Modern Healthcare
