

Using the [medicare.gov](https://www.medicare.gov) Enrollment Check Tool

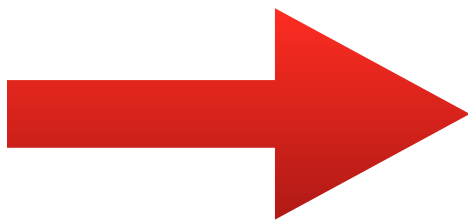
Clients may sometimes have hard time being able to provide their current Medicare enrollment status. You can check this by using the Enrollment Check tool found on [medicare.gov](https://www.medicare.gov). Follow the steps below to get started.

1. Go to www.medicare.gov and hover over the “Sign Up/Change Plans” tab found in the upper-left corner of the screen.
